





The 7 Leave No Trace Principles



1. Plan Ahead and Prepare

• Know the rules, prepare for any weather and go in smaller groups to reduce the impact.

2. Travel and Camp on Durable Surfaces

 Durable surfaces include maintained trails and designated campsites, rock, gravel, sand, dry grasses or snow. Use existing trails and sites, walking single file and keeping campsites small. In pristine areas, spread out to avoid creating a campsite.

3. Dispose of Waste Properly

 Check campsites and rest spots for any food or rubbish left behind and take it with you. Use toilets where possible, otherwise dig deep catholes. Don't wash near streams or lakes.

4. Leave What You Find

- Preserve the past: examine, photograph, but do not touch cultural or historic structures and artifacts.
- Leave rocks, plants and other natural objects as you find them.
- Avoid introducing or transporting non-native species.
- Do not build structures, furniture, or dig trenches.

5. Minimize Campfire Impacts

 Use a lightweight stove for cooking and enjoy a candle lantern for light rather than a campfire. Where fires are allowed, keep them small and use established fire rings, fire pans, or mound fires. Burn all wood and coals to ash, put out campfires completely, then scatter cool ashes.

6. Respect Wildlife

- Observe wildlife from a distance. Never feed animals and keep your food and waste secure.
- Control pets at all times, or leave them at home.
- Avoid wildlife during sensitive times: mating, nesting, raising young, or winter.

7. Be Considerate of Other Visitors

 Respect other visitors, be courteous. Yield to other users on the trail and take breaks off the trail. Avoid loud voices and noises.
