Run by Hampshire Scouts, the UK's largest Scout County with over 18,000 Scouts aged 4-25 years and 6,000 volunteers, Suisse Adventure takes over 100 young people to Kandersteg International Scout Centre in Switzerland.

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Some of the adventurers took part in an introduction course to abseiling.

The group hiked up into the mountains, before having the chance to try out the kit and experience the exciting feeling of descending down a rock face. Controlling your own descent is quite something and an experience new to many of them.

Two groups took on the mighty nearby Bunderspitz as part of two activities, some on a single day hike and the other on an overnight hike.

Both groups summited around midday after a long, hard slog up to the top. The views when they reached the top however were absolutely stunning and after a bite to eat, it made the journey onward much more bearable.

While one group went back to Kandersteg to recoup, the other is camping out in one of the huts (see their smiling faces on the front page) as we speak. We'll hear more when they return tomorrow I'm sure.






